	<ul> <li>ED reported:</li> <li>Construction of Cell 2 (both hazardous and non hazardous) now complete</li> <li>Tonnages of hazardous waste disposal had dropped</li> <li>December – February saw lower tonnages of asbestos disposal, but this should pick up again during March – May</li> <li>Asbestos contaminated waste does not appear to be affected by the economic downturn as yet</li> <li>BF reported:</li> <li>Water collected in cells containing waste is pumped out and tankered away to Avonmouth</li> <li>Repairs to the haul road are complete</li> <li>Possible earthworks to be undertaken at Parkgate Farm in the summer</li> <li>Footpath on the corner near the clay stockpile redone and does not flood as french drain has been installed</li> <li>RH advised that repairs to stiles should take place in the summer. ## 6 Household Recycling Centre (HRC)

## CC reported that:

- Purton is still one of the top performing sites in Wiltshire.
- The new Wiltshire Council will be looking to consolidate and have a consistent service provision across the county in waste collection, disposal and recycling operations and that Hills will be involved in this process
- Hills had not suffered as much as certain re-processors with regard to the drop in prices of recycled materials as it had contracts in place for sale of some recycled materials
- Income from sale of recycled materials has fallen but there are signs that prices are slowly recovering
- It is anticipated that the County will reach a 40% recycling rate this year
- North Wiltshire's recycling rate is as of January 2009 41%

JL questioned why North Wilts rate is below that of the rest of the districts. CC stated that North Wilts still operated weekly rubbish collection which did not encourage recycling. Kennet District Council and West Wilts District Council have both adopted alternate week rubbish collections (together with alternate week kerbside recycling collections) and now achieve a recycling rate of 50%.

## 7 General Waste Disposal

Government targets are:

2010 - 40%

2015 - 45%

2020 - 50%

However the Landfill Waste Directive requires a diversion of 70% of biodegradable waste from landfill by 2020.

### ED advised that:

- From July this year waste from the south of the County will be transported to an EfW (energy from waste) plant at Colnbrook (near Slough) which will in turn generate electricity.
- Hills are in discussion with Wiltshire County Council with regard to alternative waste disposal methods such as in-vessel composting; mechanical biological treatment plants (MBT) and Landfill Allowance Trading Scheme (LATS)
- A planning application by Hills for an MBT plant in Westbury will go before the planning committee in March and its outcome will not be affected by the mothballing of the Lafarge cement works in Westbury

MW reported that her department was experiencing an increase in enquiries for sites to locate these alternative waste processing plants on.

### **SCHEDULE A**

NOTE: This information applies to the Hills Purton Depot and does not include the Purton Household Recycling Centre or the other tenants in the Mopes Lane Industrial Estate (e.g. Handygas, Booth & Sons)

#### **Operating Licence**

The Operating Licence for the Purton Depot allows for 30 Large Goods Vehicles (LGVs) and 5 trailers.

There are no restricted operating hours.

### Hills' Operations

Hills currently operate 18 LGVs and 3 trailers.

From Monday to Friday there is one vehicle which leaves the depot at 04h30. This is a trade waste vehicle and needs to leave at this time to ensure that its collection round which covers industrial estates and commercial premises in the Swindon and surrounding areas is complete before car parks and narrow roads become blocked with traffic / parked vehicles.

The remainder of the fleet leaves the depot from 06h00 onwards at a rate of approximately 6 vehicles per hour.

All vehicles in the depot are parked facing forward so as to avoid the noise of reversing bleepers in the morning.

The workshop operating hours are from 06h00 to 22h00 (Monday to Friday) and Saturday mornings. The workshop usually closes at 17h00 during the week, however if there is an emergency then it could stay open until 22h00. The workshop and depot do not open on a Sunday.
