Grandmother delighted after 'recycled' cash is recovered

A woman from Wiltshire who accidentally put an envelope containing more

than £1,000 out with her recycling has expressed "absolute delight" at having

the money returned to her by staff from Hills Waste Solutions.

Ann Honour, from Chippenham, had placed the envelope containing £1,017 to

pay for building work next to a pile of newspapers she wanted to recycle. By

accident she scooped it up with the papers and placed into her kerbside

recycling bin. It was only after her kerbside box had been cleared by Hills

staff yesterday (Thurs) morning that she realised the money was gone.

A Hills spokesperson said: "Mrs Honour called our helpdesk as soon as she

realised what had happened. We immediately contacted the vehicle and

called it back to our materials recycling facility at Lower Compton.

"On arrival the paper was tipped out and half a dozen Hills staff painstakingly

searched through the pile of paper for the A4 size envelope that she had

described.

"In the end it was the driver of the collection lorry who discovered the

envelope with the money inside. We immediately sent a member of staff

round to Mrs Honour's house.

"We're really pleased to have been able to help out. Previously we have had

everything from passports to cruise tickets accidentally put out for recycling.

We're delighted Mrs Honour hasn't found herself out of pocket."

Mrs Honour said: "My daughter told me that my horoscope said I would be lucky with money but didn't think so after I realised I'd accidentally put the envelope out for recycling."

The grandmother, who is also the North Wiltshire Co-ordinator for the University of the Third Age, added: "To be honest I thought I had no chance, but I rang the help number and they said they would have a look. I was absolutely delighted when they lady called round with my envelope.

"I did give Hills a card to say thank you, which they accepted, and a reward, which they said they could not."

Hills Waste Solutions is responsible for kerbside collections of recycled material across Wiltshire. It handles around 94 tonnes each day, 251 days a year. Each recycling round is logged and there are fixed phones inside each vehicle so it was a simple matter for Hills to quickly identify which crew would have collected Mrs Honour's black box. From the time Mrs Honour called the Hills helpline at 11.30am to when the money was returned, a little over 90 minutes had elapsed.
